
National Economy

- The U.S. economy has now enjoyed 9 years of economic growth since the Great Recession
 - Real GDP grew by 4.1% in 2018Q2
 - 2.2% growth in 2018Q1
 - Nonfarm employment increased by 2.2 million jobs in 2017.
 - Unemployment rate of 3.9% in July


Tennessee's Fiscal Condition is Good

- Revenue growth has been healthy
- Revenue estimates have been very conservative
- Reserves and balances are in good shape, though TN could not sustain a significant recession without significant cuts


U.S. Real Gross Domestic Product Growth: 2000q1-2018q2




U.S. Real Gross Domestic Product Growth




The Current Expansion is Long on Historical Standards




U.S. Real Gross Domestic Product Growth




Growth in Real Personal Consumption Expenditures




Growth in Real Business Investment



The Trade Balance (Exports – Imports)




Unit Sales of New Light Vehicles



U.S. Retail Gasoline Prices




Total Consumer Debt Balance










Existing Home Sales and Housing Starts




TN & U.S. Nonfarm Job Growth



U.S. Monthly Job Gains July 2017 - July 2018




Tennessee Nonfarm Jobs 2005–2018




Tennessee Job Growth by Sector

June 2017 to June 2018



Tennessee Employment by Sector, June 2018




TN & U.S. Unemployment Rates




TN County Unemployment Rates

(September 2017)




Labor Force Participation Rate 2000-2018




Per Capita Personal Income in Tennessee Falls Below the National Average, 2018Q1



TN Per Capita Income by County – 2016




Tennesseans Have Poor Health Status Which Affects Labor Force Outcomes




Tennesseans Have Lower Educational Attainment Levels






College Completion Rates by County – 2015




Continued Importance of Education is Apparent
